- Reported by Prof. Bruce MacDonald (Chairman of NZ RAS)
- NZ RAS (New Zealand Robotics, Automation and Sensing) is initiated.
- Hosting annual conference ACRA (Australasian Conf. on Robotics & Automation)
- 16<sup>th</sup> ACRA will be held at Univ. of Melbourne in Dec. 2-4, 2014.

[[KROS](#): Korea Robotics Society] (South Korea)

- Reported by Prof. Jae-Bok Song (President of KROS)
- KROS was founded in 2003, and has now 1808 individual members (Lifetime 26, Regular 846, Student 936) and 22 company members, and still increasing)
- Publishing KROS Magazine (quarterly), Journal of Korea Robotics Society (domestic, in Korean, quarterly), and Intelligent Service Robotics (international, in English, quarterly, SCI expanded).
- Hosting KRoC (Korea Robotics Society Annual Conference, domestic, Korean) and URAI (International Conference on Ubiquitous Robots and Ambient Intelligence, annual). URAI covers all topics related to robotics in spite of its name.
- 11<sup>th</sup> URAI will be held in Kuala Lumpur (Malaysia) during Nov. 11-15, 2014. Usually about 200 papers are presented.

[TCR, CAA: Technical Committee on Robot, Chinese Association of Automation] (China)

- Reported by Prof. Fang Xu (Director of Central Research Institute, SIASUN Robot & Automation Co., Ltd).
- Chairman of TCR is Dr. QU Daokui.
- TCR was established in 1985 and it has now more than 100 members from more than 50 universities, institutes and enterprises.
- Hosting several conferences and meetings.
- Upcoming event is to host IEEE-CYBER 2015.

[[RSJ](#): Robotics Society of Japan] (Japan)

- Reported by Prof. Hisashi Osumi (Vice President of RSJ)
- RSJ was founded in 1983 and has now 4231 individual members (Regular 2939, Student 1218, Honorary 11, Lifetime 63) and 61 company members.
- Journal of the Robotics Society of Japan (in Japanese, 10 issues/year) and Advanced Robotics (International Journal, 24 issues/year) are being published.
- Domestic conference hosting
  - Annual Conference of RSJ (Sep): about 700 presentations, about 1,200 participants.
  - Robotics Symposia (Mar, in collaboration with JSME and SICE): about 100 presentations, about 200 participants.
  - Symposium on Construction Robots (every 2 years, in collaboration with Society of Civil Engineers, Architectural Institute of Japan, etc): about 60 presentations, about 200 participants
  - Also, sponsoring Robomech, SII, etc.
- International conference hosting
  - IEEE/RSJ International Conference on Intelligent Robots and Systems (IROS)
  - International Symposium on Robot and Human Communication (Ro-Man)
  - International Robotics Forum for High School Students (IRH 2013)
  - Also, sponsoring AROB, MFI, SMC, ICAR, ISR, etc.
- Many activities related to Great East Japan Earthquake Disaster
  - Surveillance Committee on Tohoku Earthquake
  - Surveillance Committee on Extensive Technical Platform for Disaster Response, etc.
- Major government projects launched in 2014
  - Inspection and Maintenance Robots
  - Anti-Disaster Robots
  - Construction Robots, etc.

4. Discussion on present and future work

- Introduction of [RST](#) (Robotics Society of Taiwan)
  - Prof. Ren Luo (Honorary President) and Prof. Li-Chen Fu (Director) participated in the meeting, and Prof. Luo introduced RST history and activities.
  - RST was founded in 2007, and current President is Prof. Tzue-Hseng S. Li.
  - 64 Regular members and 27 student members in 2014
  - International Conf. on Advanced Robotics and Intelligent Systems (ARIS) and National Conf. on Advanced Robotics (NCAR) are being hosted by RST.
  - Robot Competitions including International Competition of Intelligent Humanoid Robotics, Taiwan Intelligent Robot Contest, and RoboCup Junior Taiwan Open are being hosted by RST
- RST is approved as a new member of ARSU.
- MoU (form and signatures) will be updated by RSJ to include all the member societies.
- Malaysia may be invited as an observer society next year.
- ARSU website will be updated and managed by RSJ.
- If you have anything to post at ARSU website, then send it to RSJ.

- Hosting includes arranging the meeting place and lunch, announcement of the meeting, and their budget.
- The host society is decided in the ARSU Summit Meeting two years in advance.
