What does the ARAA do?



- The Association organises/manages conferences and other meetings
 - Australasian Conference on Robotics & Automation (ACRA)
 - Field and Service Robotics conferences
- Act as a focal point for Australian media interested in Robotics (exec. receives regular phone enquires and emails)

- Annual conference since 1999
 - ACRA 2016: 41 submitted, 34 papers accepted, 78 registered attendees
 - Smaller than usual
- Provides a supportive forum for Australian researchers to present recent research.
- Creates a national robotics community in Australia and New Zealand
 - foster better funding outcomes, ARC, etc.
 - Provides better international visibility of Australian and New Zealand robotics research
- Proceedings freely available (<u>www.araa.asn.au</u>)
- ARAA website updated in 2014 to provide a more modern template and easier maintenance
